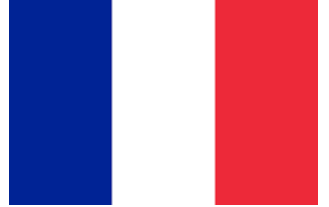

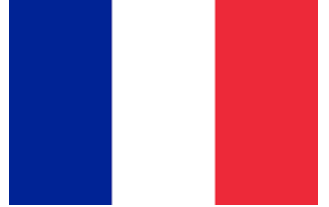

The specific demands of the captains are more restrictive than expected. Delivery masks for the crew(zero onboard) should be prepared by Company on arrival To minimize contact only Loading Master and Pilot allowed on board. All paper works should be done on shore, signing and stamping by e-mail; All clients after mooring their yacht at position in the cargo hold should be picked up and leave the vessel by service boats via stern door, not coming up onboard ;Diving ops via stern door from diving boat, diving equipment and cylinders changing from diving boat only. Not allowed came up onboard. Shore welders and riggers not allowed on board as well. We operate the unloading survey under these restrictive conditions...

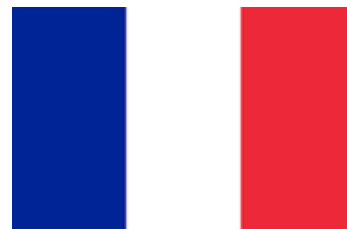

1. Main measures taken by government (max. 2 lines of explanation for each measure)

- CONFINEMENT** : The confinement is supposed to last until 14th March 2021. On or about 11th March 2021, the local Prefect will take a decision on whether or not to maintain it.
- NON ESSENTIAL BUSINESS' CLOSURE** : The places receiving people will remain closed, except for food stores, restaurants only allowed for take-away and delivery, pharmacies and essential services like banks.
- BORDERS' CLOSURE** :
- OTHERS** : Sanitary evacuation of patients from Mayotte to Reunion Island is increasing dangerously to the point that practically all intensive care units are getting occupied. We also learnt that nosocomial infections in Mayotte hospitals are increasing and will possibly get out of control soon.

The greater part of the public is not allowed to move about freely on the Island, the economic and Port activities are maintained. Ships continue to call at Longoni.

There is no curfew restriction in force but a confinement. As from 18 :00 hrs, all food stores and/or chemists close. All employees tend to get back home well before that time. All night business trips must absolutely be supported by a signed justification.

There is a control of compelling reasons for travelling from Mayotte to the rest of the national territory. Travelers must submit a justification of compelling reason to the prefecture up to 6 days before the date of the flight. This measure will take effect from 3rd March 2021.

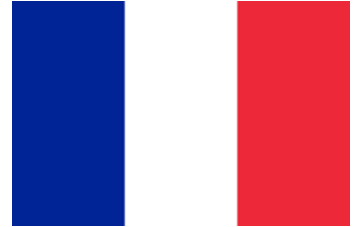

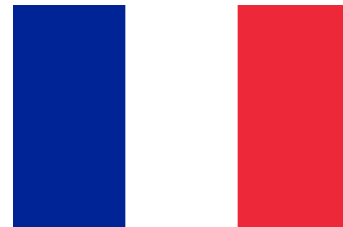

- CONFINEMENT** : The massive gathering of people (more than 10 persons) is prohibited. It is obligatory for all citizens in the Albanian territory to wear a mask even in open spaces. The children younger than 11 years and other persons that cannot wear a mask on health reasons are excluded from this obligation. Currently there is a curfew during period 20 :00 – 06 :00.
- NON ESSENTIAL BUSINESS' CLOSURE** : Businesses are open, including bars and restaurants, which are required to respect safety protocols.
- BORDERS' CLOSURE** : Land borders of Albania with neighbouring countries for the free movement of people are opened. Actually all nationalities are allowed to enter in Albania. Trucks and other cargo movement are allowed and continue normally.

2. Port's situation (max. 10 lines)

All seaports are open. There are no restrictions in handling of cargo vessels, ro-ro vessels, tankers and gas-carriers. Ferryboats vessels (including passengers) to/from Italian ports are allowed. Both shipping lines and passengers should respect the safety protocols. Actually, all nationalities are allowed to enter in Albania. The yachts and other touristic boats are allowed in ports.

- CONFINEMENT** : State of emergency prolonged up to 28.3.2021. Wearing medical face masks compulsory outside in built-up areas. Wearing respirators compulsory in public transport, at bus/tram/metro stations, shops and inside all buildings. Services and retail sale are forbidden with exception of foodstuffs, petrol stations, drugstores, medical shops, pet shops, newspaper shops, repair shops, flower shops, couriers, etc. Restaurants are open for take away food only. Distance learning in place. It is forbidden to travel to other districts if the reason is other than work, doctor, taking necessary care of family members, etc. Movement of persons between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. is not allowed (with exceptional cases of travelling to work, doctor, walking the dog, etc.). Home office style of work is strongly recommended to companies and generally, people are recommended to travel to work, doctor or for sport/walk in nature outside only. Weekly testing of employees is compulsory for middle and large companies and will soon become compulsory for small companies. The health care system is exhausted and reaching its capacities. Daily numbers of newly infected people have been decreasing in the recent days. Vaccination of high-risk citizens, healthcare workers and teachers under way, but supply of vaccines does not comply with the originally ordered quantities, which is delaying the whole process. Deliveries of vaccines expected to be higher in April.

- BORDERS' CLOSURE** : Foreigners are allowed to enter the Czech Republic only for special reasons (work, study, visiting family, health and social services, weddings, funerals).

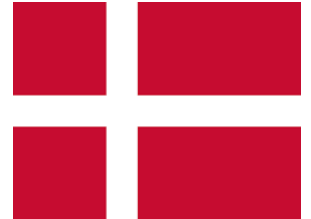

- CONFINEMENT** : Danish authorities have banned gatherings of over 25 people outdoor. Numbers of people in grocery stores and pharmacies are depending of the space. People in public closed places have to wear a mask.

The so-called 2 + 2 rule remains in force in public places and indoors, which means that up to two people who have to keep a distance of two meters from the others can move together outdoors or indoors. The rule does not apply to families or homes. The rule applies throughout Estonia to all activities that do not take place at home.

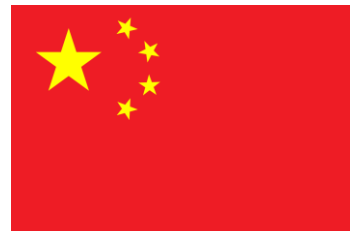

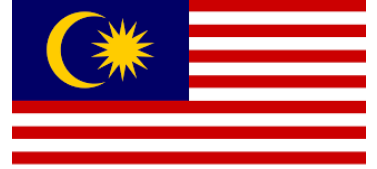

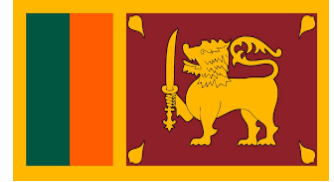

On March 13th, Chile will be exactly one year in a "State of Exception" with restriction to constitutional rights and with a nightly curfew for an entire year. Chilean President extended the period every 90 days, but now after one year, the Parliament needed to approve the President's recommendation to extend it for another 90 days, until June 2021. It remains to be seen if the nightly curfew will be extended as well.

January and February are traditional holiday month and a week ago schools opened once again. Infections had been dropping constantly as of October/November, but now during holiday season, the numbers are rising again and occupancy of beds in hospitals is reaching a critical percentage.

On a brighter note, Chile has started mass vaccination a few weeks ago, starting with elderly people. Approx. 1% of the population is vaccinated every day; around 28.7% of the population has already received the first doses and 7.3% the second doses. It is expected to reach herd immunity (70% of population) in about 100 days. Chile is one of the leading countries world-wide with vaccination of its population.

As previously informed the Government has implemented a 5-step program to return to "normality". These are:

- 1) Quarantine: limited circulation, permits needed to buy essential goods (max 2/week). Sanitary check-points between Regions.
- 2) Transition period: Free circulation Mo-Fr. Elderly above 75 years of age still not permitted to leave home. Opening of business.
- 3) Preparation: Restaurants are permitted opening only outside, with limitations. Shopping Malls are opening with limited access.
- 4) Initial opening: More people allowed at Restaurants, Bars, Malls.
- 5) Advanced opening: gradually opening of more recreational activities, etc.

At present around 70% of the population is under full (7-day) quarantine or in Phase 2 with lock-down on weekends.

Today 14,952 examinations were carried out and 2,700 new cases of coronavirus were detected, making this day the one with the most registered infections since March 2020.

The positivity rate (number of positive tests over the total number of tests performed) rose from 9.96% yesterday to 18.05% today (also a record).

On the other hand, it was reported in the report of the National Emergency System on Monday that there were 19 deaths from coronavirus today, the highest number recorded in one day (thus, the total number of deaths amounted to 811).

There are 14,418 people suffering from the disease (record number), 188 admitted to intensive care (also the highest since March of last year).

The population between 18 to 70 years, is being vaccinated throughout the country with Sinovac vaccine. Over 70 years with Pfizer vaccine.

The Executive Board submitted a bill to Parliament in order to extend the limitation of the right of assembly and continue with the prohibition of crowds.

A bill was also submitted that establishes a battery of measures of economic reactivation for SMEs.

Public offices will be closed, except for essential services.

Clubs, gyms, and amateur sports practices will be closed. "In principle, professional sport continues to develop," explained the president.

Free shops are closed on the border.

Public shows are suspended throughout the country.

Bars and restaurants will close at 0.00 throughout the country (in some departments the hours had been extended until 2.00) and it will be exhorted that the food courts of the shopping malls be closed.

"In coordination with the municipalities of Salto and Paysandú", it was decided to close the thermal complexes during the Holy Week.

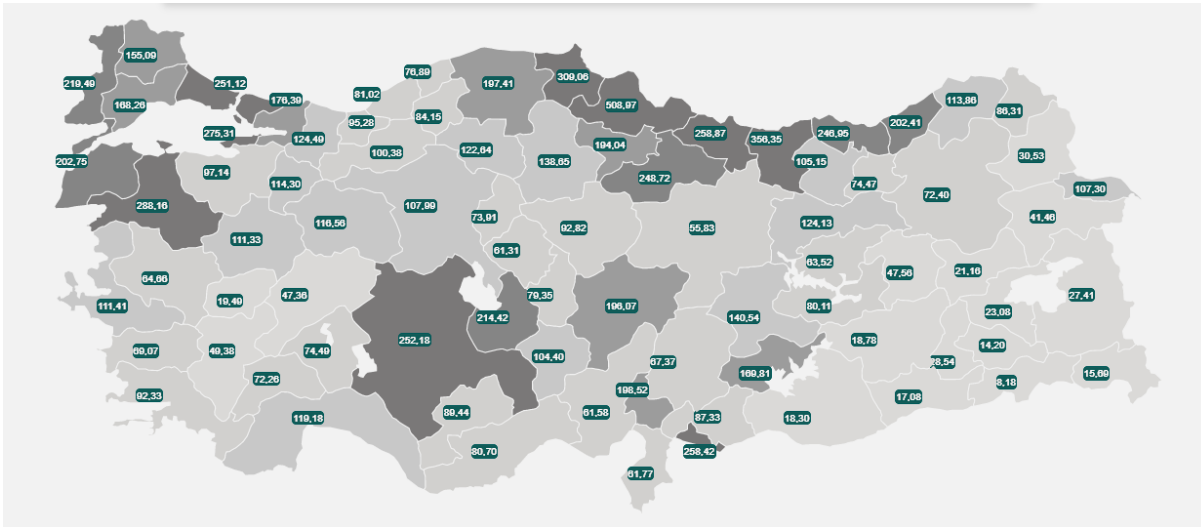

The Australian government has banned the export of some equipment that could help efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19, including: disposable face masks, disposable gloves, disposable gowns, goggles, glasses or eye visors, alcohol wipes, hand sanitizer.

All commercial vessels must now use the Maritime Arrivals Reporting System (MARS) for all vessel pre-arrival reporting.

All vessels entering Australia that have a suspected case of COVID-19 on board will not be allowed to unload goods or disembark travellers until cleared to do so by the human biosecurity officer.

Where vessels have a suspected case of COVID-19 on board, a human biosecurity officer will screen for COVID-19, determine the appropriate course of action and issue directions.

3. Inland transports' situation (max. 10 lines)

State Borders reopened across Australia.

Transport or freight of goods is exempt from border controls on the condition that the person performing the services must meet State exemption requirements; hold and display a border permit, wear a mask, practise social distancing, remain self-quarantined and submit a COVID-19 management plan.

Freight, transport or logistics operators may be required to show evidence of having received a negative COVID-19 test result and where entering Tasmania or Western Australia may also undergo screening and testing on arrival.
